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To Timothy Johnson Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County — — — Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the tenth day of November next it being the second Monday of said month at nine O'clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor and Lieutenant Governor, of this Commonwealth, and six Senators all on one ballot for the district of Middlesex. And Also to choose a Representative to Represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of January next.

And likewise to bring in their written votes for a County Commissioner, for the County of Middlesex, for the residue of the term for which Timothy Fletcher Esq., was elected to that Office. — — — Polls to be opened at ten O'clock A.M.

And you are furthermore required to notify the inhabitants of said Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town affairs to meet at the above named place at ten O'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To bring in their votes for a Register of Deeds for the County of Middlesex for the residue of the term for which William F. Stone Esq., was elected to that Office.
- 3^d To see if the town will build a town house. to do or act on this article as they shall think best.
- 4th To hear and act on all Reports that may be presented.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each of the public Meetinghouses in said town fourteen days at least before the time for holding said Meeting.

Whereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of meeting aforesaid.
