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To Timothy Johnson Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County — Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town affairs to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the eighth day of December next at one of the clock in the afternoon precisely to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To bring in their votes for a Register of Deeds for the County of Middlesex for the residue of the term for which William F. Stone Esq. was elected to that office.
- 3^d To see if the town will build a town house, to do or act on this article as they shall think best.
- 4th To see if the town will choose a Committee to let out the Making of a Road laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Sewell Hunt, to do or act as they shall think best.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each of the public Meetinghouses in said town fourteen days at least before the for holding said Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk on or before the time of Meeting aforesaid.
