In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed
to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote, in town affairs
to meet at the Meetinghouse of the first Parish in said town on Monday the twelfth
day of January inst. at two of the clock in the afternoon precisely, to act on the
following articles viz.

- 1st To choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To see if the town will give their Building Committee of the townhouse
liberty, to make an alteration in their plan of the house and land.
- 3^d To see if the town will authorize their Treasurer to receive the Deed
for a piece of land to set the townhouse upon.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested
copy thereof at each of the Public Meetinghouses in said town two Sabbaths at
least before the time of holding said Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon
to the town clerk at or before the time of Meeting aforesaid.
