To Timothy Johnson Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town affairs to meet at the Meeting house of the first Parish in said town on Monday the second day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon precisely to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
- 3^d To bring in their votes for a Register of Deeds for the County of Middlesex.
- 4th To Choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 5th To determine the manner of repairing high ways and Bridges the year ensuing and grant money for the same.
- 6th To hear and act on all Reports.
- 7th To see if the town will furnish wood for the several schools from the Poor Farm the year ensuing, to do or act as they shall think best.
- 8th To see if the town will, instruct their town house Committee to procure a Bell and Clock to be placed upon the town house to do or act, as they shall think best.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at each of the public Meeting houses in said town fourteen days at least before the of holding said Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of Meeting aforesaid.
