At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury, held on Monday the second day of March D. 1846 the articles in the preceding Warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner viz.

1st Chose Capt. Abel B. Jones Moderator.

It was then voted adjourn this meeting to the Hall of Charles Moore Met according to foregoing adjournment.

2^d Gave in their votes for a County Treasurer as follows viz.

Whole no. of votes one hundred and eight

For Stedman Buttrick one hundred and six

" Ephraim B. Patch one

" Caleb Hayden one

3^d Gave in their votes for Register of Deeds as follows viz.

Whole no. one hundred and twenty.

For Ephraim B. Patch ninety.

" Caleb Hayden twenty five.

" Nathaniel R. Whitney five.

4th Chose Ephraim Stone town clerk who was qualified in open town meeting by Dury Fairbank Esq.

Selectmen — Abel B. Jones, Loring Wheeler Thomas B. Battles.

Assessors — Levi Dow, Charles Gerry, George W. Gatts.

Overseers of the Poor Joseph Smith, Samuel N. Bower, Webster Cutting

Treasurer — Nahum Thompson.

Then voted to adjourn this meeting to tomorrow March 3^d at one of the clock in the afternoon precisely.

Tuesday March 3^d D 1846-- Met agreeable to the foregoing adjournment.

Voted to put over the choice of Constable & Collector to April

meeting. Then voted to pass the 4th article for the present and take up the 5th

5th Under this article it was voted to choose a Committee of ten (two from each school district) to investigate the subject of repairing the high ways and town ways the ensuing year, and report to the town at April Meeting. — the following persons were chosen that Committee viz. Col. Dury Fairbank, Capt. William Brigham, Reuben Haynes, Capt. Israel Haynes, Capt. Lyman Howe, Col. Ephraim Moore, C. G. Butler Esq. Charles Gerry, Jonathan R. Vose, Asahel Balcom.
