to be divided among the several surveyors in the same way the grant was for summer. and the Money allotted to each surveyor ~~and~~ shall be expended under his direction to keep the roads passable in the winter season. and if it not necessary to spend the aforesaid Money to keep the roads in repair in the winter the same shall be worked out in March or April in their respective wards and make return of their doings on or before the first day of May D^o 1847.

and that the assessors be requested to make the aforesaid grants in separate taxes and put their directions accordingly. The surveyors shall give every man an opportunity to work out his taxes. and if after due notice being given such man shall neglect or refuse to work out his tax the surveyor shall report him so that he may be dealt with accordingly. The price of labour shall be 12½ cts. per hour for a man; and the same for a pair of Oxen and Cart.

10th Voted that the Selectmen be directed to so alter the limits of the Highway wards at the north part of the town as to make an additional ward

11th Voted to pass over.

12th Voted to accept of a list of furors as made out by the Selectmen.

13th Voted to discount to Timothy Johnson the following Taxes viz.

14th Voted appropriate the sum of three hundred seventy one dollars twenty five cents now in the hands of the Treasurer towards paying for the townhouse.
