

April 1846 -

- 15th Voted to leave the subject of this article discretionary with the Overseers of the Poor.
- 16th Voted that the town house committee be instructed to consult council in reference to the ownership of the Common, then if in their opinion it does belong to the first Parish that they be directed to confer with them, or with any individual, for a spot to set the townhouse upon and to make a report at the adjourned Meeting.
- 17th Voted to accept of a Road laid out by the Selectmen on the petition of Lyman Howe & others. then voted to grant the sum of three hundred ninety dollars & twenty seven cents for damages & making said Road. Chose the following persons a committee to let out the Making of said Road viz. Buckley Howe, Solomon Dutton, Nahum Parmenter.

Voted to take up the 2^d article and chose the following town officers, viz. Measurers of Wood. Nahum Thompson, Charles Fishers, Edwin Harrington.

Pound Keeper. Abijah Powers

Highway Surveyor Emory Smith

Chose Asahel Balcom Constable and collector who agrees to collect the Taxes for one cent & four mills on the dollar and do all other business usually done by the Constable free of expence to the town.

Voted to adjourn this Meeting to Monday the 20th inst. at two of the clock in the afternoon precisely

April 20th 1846 Met according to adjournment, and chose James Moore Clerk pro tem. who was qualified by N. Thompson Esq.

Then voted to take up the 1st article & excused Winthrop Puffer from serving as juror & Henry Vose was selected to fill the vacancy.

Voted to take up the 2^d art. and chose Asahel Balcom Field-Driven in place of James Quinn
