✓ Then took up the 16th article, and the Townhouse Committee made a report to the town by reading the opinion of Mr. Chout Council for said town. Then voted that the Committee go out and confer with the Committee of the first Parish and see on what terms the town can have a spot on the Common to set their town ^{house} upon and report at this meeting. Adjourned untill the Committee were ready to report. The meeting was again resumed. The Parish said by their Committee they would relinquish all the right said Parish has in that part of the Common on which the school house now stands, provided, the town will remove said school house. Then voted to set the town house where the school house now stands provided said Parish adhere to their agreement; which is as follows.

At a legal meeting of the members of the First Parish in Sudbury held on Monday the twentieth day of April 1846 Voted that said Parish give to the town of Sudbury liberty to set a town house on the meeting house common near by and partly on that part now occupied by the Centre school house sufficient for the occupation of said town house and ten feet passage around it; provided said gift to said town shall not be construed in any way to injure the title of said Parish to the remainder of the said common.

Then voted to instruct the building Committee to remove the school house and grade the spot suitable for the reception of said town house.

Then took up the \$ Accts. and allowed the following accounts viz: Nathan Haynes \$500, Isaac Noyes \$375, Abiathur Carver \$394 Granted the sum of twelve Dollars & sixty nine Cents to pay the same.

Then voted to dissolve this meeting
