In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Meetinghouse of the First Parish in said town on Monday the twentieth day of April current at two of the clock in the afternoon precisely to act on the following articles viz.

- 1<sup>st</sup> To Choose a Moderator
- 2<sup>d</sup> To see if the town will grant a suitable sum of money for the townhouse to do or act as they shall think best.
- 3<sup>d</sup> To see if the town will discount certain taxes that may be offered.
- 4<sup>th</sup> To see if the town will authorise the Assessors to take the valuation of personal property the present year.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each of the public Meetinghouses in said town two sabbaths at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Whereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doing thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting aforesaid.
