L.S. To Asahel Balcom Constable of the town
L.S. of Sudbury in said County Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in election to meet at the meeting house of the first Parish in said town on Monday the ninth day of November next it being the second Monday of said month at ten O'clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor and Lieutenant Governor of this Commonwealth, and six Senators all on one ballot for the district of Middlesex.

And also to bring in their votes for a Representative of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for district number four.

And likewise to choose a Representative to Represent said town in the General Court of the Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of January next.

Polls to be opened at eleven O'clock A.M.

And you are furthermore required to notify the inhabitants of said town qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the above named time and place to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To Choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To see if the town will allow Abel Parmenter further damage for land taken for a Road laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Symon Howe and others to do or act as they shall think best.
- 3^d To see if the town will give Messrs Knight & Maynard liberty to cross the Road at the west part of the town, in constructing a Canal to do or act as they shall think best when met.
- 4th To see if the town will discount certain Taxes that may be offered.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at each of the public Meeting houses in said town fourteen days at least before the time for holding said meeting.
