

March 1847

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town affairs held on Monday the first day of March D. 1847 the articles in the preceding warrant were acted upon in the following manner viz.

1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator.

2^d Gave in their votes for County Treasurer as follows viz.

Whole number of votes. sixty six.

For Hedman Buttrick sixty six.

3^d Chose the following town officers.

Town Clerk Ephraim Stone who was qualified in open town Meeting.

Selectmen. Timothy Johnson, Walter Rogers Jr. Joseph Smith.

It was then voted to pass this article for the present and take up the 6th.

Heard the report of the town house Committee

Voted to accept of the report.

in favor of accepting sixty eight.

Voted to take up the 3^d article.

" against " sixty three.

Voted to adjourn the meeting to tomorrow March 2^d at ten O'Clock A. M. precisely at this place.

March 2^d 1847 Met agreeable to the foregoing adjournment. - 3^d article Voted that the Selectmen be Assessors.

Then Voted to reconsider the last vote and proceed to ballot for Assessors.

Assessors. Chose John W. Haynes, Asahel Balcom, John A. Maynard

Voted to reconsider the vote whereby the town accepted the report of the Town House Committee. Then voted to pass over the 3^d Art for the present and take up the 6th article.

It was then voted to instruct said Committee to confer with the assignee and see if he would settle with them, by his making a discount of twenty five dollars from the terms of said contract. Then Voted to lay the whole subject upon the table untill the Committee were ready to report.

Voted to take up the 3^d article.

Then Voted that the Selectmen be Overseers of the Poor Treasurer. Parnum Thompson

Voted to reconsider the vote whereby the town voted that the Selectmen be Overseers of the Poor, and chose the following persons Overseers. Samuel R. Bowker Webster Cutting John P. Allen
