

April 1847.

At a legal Meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections and Town affairs held on Monday the fifth day of April A.D. 1847 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner.

1st. Gave in to the Selectmen their written Votes on one ballot for three County Commissioners; and also their written Votes on one ballot for two Special County Commissioners for the County of Middlesex; all which while said meeting was yet open were docted and counted and public declaration thereof was made in said meeting by the Selectmen and the same was as follows to wit.

For two Special County Commissioners.

For Charles Tower of Stow one hundred sixty one

" John Fletcher of Acton forty

3^d Excused John P. Allen from serving as Field Officer and chose in his place Charles Hunt.
