The following persons declined serving as school Committee viz. John Hunt, Joel Dakin, Abel B. Richardson, and Buckley Howe. And chose for School Committee Nahum Thompson, Aaron S. Thompson, Charles Gery, Joseph C. Horoe

High Way Surveyors Charles Haynes, Isaac Clark, Jonathan Bacon, Joel Dakin, Moses Gasfield, Augustus Heard, John Sawyer, Levi Vose, Nanan Parmenter, Reuben Haynes Jr., Israel Hunt, Abel Parmenter.

4th Voted to grant the same sum to repair Highways and Bridges as was granted last year, and that it be expended in the same manner.

Voted to choose a Committee of three to examine Canal Bridge and put the same in good repair. Chose Cyrus Taylor, George W. Gates, and Benjamin Smith, said Committee. It was then voted that the same Committee examine Shermans Bridge, Panty Bridge, the Bridge near Col. Moores Mills and the Bridge near Abel Haydens and that said Committee be instructed to repair the same if necessary.

5th Voted to grant the following sums viz.

For the support of the Poor two hundred and fifty dollars.

For Summer Schools two hundred and fifty dollars

For Winter Schools Four hundred dollars.

Fuel seventy five dollars

For a school at the west part of the town, fifteen dollars.

For Incidental expences two hundred dollars

For to pay Assessors twenty dollars

For to pay the Treasurer ten dollars.

For repairing Canal Bridge seventy five dollars.

Voted to pass this Act. for the present.

6th Voted that the money granted for schools be distributed in the same manner as last year, and that the Amt. granted for summer schools be expended in the year 1848.

7th Voted to accept of the Report of the Committee on accounts.
