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To Asahel Balcom Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the nineteenth day of April current at two of the clock in the after noon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To fill all vacancies occurring in town offices by reason of non-acceptance.
- 3^d To see if the town will instruct the assessors to take the valuation of personal property the present year.
- 4th To see if the town will take measures to procure lights for their town hall to do or act as they shall think best.
- 5th To see if the town will take measures to have the report of their school committee for 1846. printed for the use of the town.
- 6th To hear and act on all reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your damages thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
