To Asahel Balcom Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the thirteenth day of September current at two O'clock in the afternoon precisely there and there to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To see if the town will remove and repair the School house in the Central School district to do or act on the subject of a school house for said district as the town shall think proper when met.
- 3^d To see if the town will appropriate thirty four dollars twenty five cents (left in a grant for making a Road in 1845) — and twelve dollars forty seven cents (left on the grant for Highways in 1844) towards paying for the Chandeliers in the town hall.
- 4th To see if the town will instruct the Overseers of the Poor to remove and repair the Mill house on the poor farm to do or act as they shall think best.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at each of the public Meetinghouses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of Meeting as aforesaid.
