And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each of the public meeting houses in said town fourteen days at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
