To Asahel Balcom Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the town Hall in said town on Monday the third day of April next at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz

- 1st To choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To choose all necessary town officers not chosen at March Meeting.
- 3^d To grant money for all necessary purposes.
- 4th To direct how the school money shall be distributed and when expended.
- 5 To hear and act on all Reports.
- 6th To see if the town will appropriate any unappropriated money now in the Treasury for the Support of the Poor.
- 7th To see if the town will give the inhabitants the use of the town Hall the ensuing year for the same purposes, and on the same conditions, as last year, to do or act as they shall think best.
- 8th To see if the town will direct the manner of warning town meetings in future, to do or act, as they shall think best.
- 9th To see what method the town will take to collect their taxes the present year.
- 10th To see if ^{the} town will discount any taxes that may be offered for discount.
- 11th To see if the town will choose a committee to meet the County Commissioners on the petitions of Charles R. Train and others, and Lyman Howe and others.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at each of the public meeting houses in said town fourteen days at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
