

April 1848.

7th Voted that the Town Hall be used for all suitable purposes by application being made to the Selectmen the expence of Warming Lighting and taking care of the house to be paid by those occupying the Hall.

Voted to take up the 5th article.

Voted accept of the School Committees Report. then Voted to instruct the Chairman of Said Committee to cause the Report to be printed for the use of the town.

The Committee Chosen to take into consideration the Subject of New districting the town and examine the School houses made their Report. Voted not to accept of Said Report.

Then Voted to reconsider the Vote whereby they refused to accept of said report and Voted to accept.

Voted to adjourn this Meeting to Monday the 17th inst. at one of the clock in the afternoon precisely.

Monday April 17th 1848.

Met agreeable to the adjournment the 5th Article under consideration.

Voted to reconsider the Vote whereby the town Voted to accept of the Report of the Committee on accounts. then Voted to add Joseph Smiths bill of \$2 then Voted to accept said Report as amended and grant money to pay the same.

8th Voted that town Meetings in future be warned by posting one copy of the warrant at the town house and that when a warrant is posted two Sabbaths before the time set for holding meetings it shall be considered a legal notice.

It was then Voted to instruct the Selectmen to procure a box suitable for posting warrants to be placed on the town house.

9th Voted that all single poll Taxes be payable on demand and all other Taxes be paid in three instalments Viz. 20th Oct. 20th Dec. and 20th Feby.

Voted to take up the 8th article

Voted to grant two hundred and fifty dollars for Summer Schools for 1849.

" " " four hundred dollars for Winter Schools.

" " " fifteen dollars for a school at the West part of the town

" " " Seventy five dollars for Fuel

" " " two hundred dollars for Incidental expences

" " " one hundred and forty nine dollars $\frac{30}{100}$ to pay accounts.

" " " Sixty dollars to pay Interest on the Orusha Howe Fund.
