- 2^d To see if the town will take measures to New district the town and build one
 or more school houses the present year to do, or act, on the subject of School
 districts, and School houses, as the town shall think best when met.
- 3^d To see if the town will give the Selectmen any instructions in reference to the
 line between the towns of Frammingham and Sudbury to do, or act as they
 shall think best.
- 4th To see if the town will purchase a Wagon to be used on the Poor Farm.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy
 thereof at each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at
 least before the time set for holding said meeting.

 thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
