In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the "Town Hall" in said town on Monday the nineteenth day of June current at two of the clock in the afternoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1st To Choose a Moderator

2^d To hear and act on all Reports.

3^d To see if the town will make any alteration in the mode of warming town meetings, to do or act as they think best.

4th To see if the town will give the School house Committee further instructions in reference to repairing the several school houses or rebuilding said houses, to do or act on the subject of school houses, or school districts, as the town shall think best when met.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid
