To Samuel A Jones Constable of the

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to
Vote in town affairs to meet at the "Town Hall" in said town on Monday
the fourteenth day of August current at three of the clock in the after-
noon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator2nd To hear and act on all Reports

3^d To hear the Report of the Committes chosen to build and repair the
School houses and to see if the town will designate a suitable place for
a school house and necessary buildings for the first school district
and take measures to procure the same or act in any manner upon
the subject matter of this article which the town may think proper.

4th To see if the town will choose a Committee to meet the County Com-
missioners on the petition of William H. Knight and others to do or
act as they shall think best when met.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested
copy thereof at the townhouse and each of the public Meeting houses in
in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said
meeting.

Hereof fail not to make return of this warrant with your doings
thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid
