At a Legal town meeting held at Sudbury on Monday the fourteenth day August, A. D. 1848 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows

- 1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator
 - 2^d The Selectmens Report in reference to the line between Sudbury and Frammingham was read. Voted to accept of so much of said Report as has reference to examining the records, that the remainder be erased.
 - 3^d Voted to accept of the Report of the School house Committee.
- Then Voted that the town hereby designate a piece of land belonging to Capt. Uriah Moore between the house of said Moore and the Turbin Barn as a suitable place for a school house and other necessary buildings for the first school district, and that the Selectmen be a Committee to purchase so much of said lot as in their judgment necessary for said purpose, if they can agree with the owner for a reasonable price if not that the Selectmen may proceed according to law in reference to a place for such school house and buildings.
- 4th Voted that the Selectmen be a Committee to meet the County Commissioners on the petition of William H. Knight & others
- Voted that it be discretionary with said committee whether to oppose or favor the wishes of the petitioners

Voted to dissolve the meeting James Moore Moderator
