In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitant of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the town hall in said town on Monday the fourth day of September next at three of the clock in the afternoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator.

2^d To hear the Report of the Selectmen chosen to purchase a school house lot for the centu district and act thereon.

3^d To see if the town will accept of the location of a school house lot for the centu district as laid out by the Selectmen to do or act on the subject of a school house lot as the town shall think best.

4th To see if the town will accept an alteration made by the Selectmen in the Road near the house of J. D. Cutters on the petition of Walter Rogers & others.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
