1st To choose a Mediator.

2^d To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer to borrow money to pay the expenses of repairing the several School houses to do or act as the town shall think best.

3^d To see if the town will take measures to rebuild or repair the Panty Bridge to do or act on this article as the town shall think best when met.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
