At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections held on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in the month of November one thousand eight hundred and forty eight being the seventh day of said month for the purpose of giving in their votes for Electors of President and Vice President of the United States the whole number of persons who gave in their votes was ascertained as directed in the Revised Statutes by counting the whole number of ballots given in: And the whole number of ballots was two hundred fifty one

And the whole number of votes given in were received sorted counted and declared and record thereof made in open town meeting as by law directed: and said votes were as follows viz.
