Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the thirtieth day of November current being the second Monday of said month at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor, and Lieutenant Governor, of this Commonwealth and Six Senators all on one ballot for the district of Middlesex.

And also to bring in on a separate ballot their votes for a Representative of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for district number four.

And likewise to choose a Representative to Represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday January next.

Polls to be opened at Eleven O'clock A.M. precisely.

And also to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator

2^d To hear and act on all Reports

3^d To see if the town will take any measures to repair the Road leading from the great Road nearly opposite the House of Thomas Stearns to the Road leading from David Lincoln's to Wash Bridge to do or act on the subject of said Road as the town may think proper when met

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

And if fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
