In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections to meet at the town Hall in said town on Monday the twenty seventh day of November current at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Representative to represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of January next.

Polls opened at Eleven O'Clock A.M.

And also to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator.

2^d To see if the town will take any measures in reference to the line between the town of Sudbury and Frammingham to do or act on the subject as the town shall think best.

3^d To see if the town will discount to the land owners the tax on the land claimed by the town of Frammingham.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
