At a Legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the eleventh day of December A.D. 1848, the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows, viz.

1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator.

2^d Voted that all persons owning or keeping a Dog, shall procure a License for the same on payment of one dollar. That all persons procuring such License shall cause to be constantly kept about the neck of such dog a collar with the name and place of residence of such owner or keeper legibly marked on the same And no such dog shall be permitted to go at large without a sufficient muzzle to prevent their biting, for the next Three months.

Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to grant Licenses agreeable to the foregoing vote.

Voted that the above bye laws go into effect forthwith.

Voted to choose a Board of Health to consist of five, one in each School district who were instructed to see that the foregoing bye laws are complied with. Voted that they be chosen by nomination.

Chose the following persons viz. Dr. C. C. Johnson Emory Conant, Nichols Brown, Joseph Voyer, and Asahel Balcom. Voted that they be authorised to fill all vacancies that may occur in their board.

Voted to dissolve the meeting.
