At a Legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to vote at Elections held on Monday the first day of January A.D. 1849. the following votes were given in voted, counted, recorded and declaration thereof made as the constitution requires viz.

For Representative to Congress District Number Four. Whole number of Ballots was one hundred fifty nine

And they were for the following persons viz.

Frederick Robinson eighty nine

Benjamin Thompson thirty five

John G. Palfrey thirty five

The articles in the preceding Warrant were then taken up and acted upon as follows. viz.

1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator.

2^d Voted that all Bye Laws passed at the last meeting in reference to restraining Dogs be suspended excepting that part providing that all Dogs going at large shall have a collar about the neck with the name and place of residence of the owner legally marked on the same.

It was then voted that all money paid License be refunded.

3^d Voted to pass over.
