In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections to meet at the "Town Hall" in said town on Monday the fifth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Representative of this Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for District Number four.

Polls to be opened at half past ten o'clock A.M.

And you are also required to notify the inhabitants of said Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections and town affairs to meet at the place, and on the day aforesaid, at Eleven of the clock in the forenoon then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator.

2^d To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.

3^d To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
