The Treasurer has also borrowed agreeable to a vote of the town for the purpose of paying for the Schoolhouses built and repaired the past year three thousand eight hundred & six dollars and has paid the same to the building Committee by order of the Selectmen.

The Treasurer gave a Note for one thousand twenty five dollars payable in three years with interest annually and received for the same one thousand dollars only which will amount to a fraction short of seven per cent. for the money for the time. He also gave a Note for Seven hundred and fourteen dollars payable in one year with interest and received only seven hundred dollars, which is eight per cent. and a fraction for the money.

All the remainder was borrowed at six per cent. per annum and Notes given accordingly.
