To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County. Meeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections and town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the eleventh day of June current at one of the clock in the afternoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes for a Representative of this Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for District number four.

Polls to be opened at half past one O'clock precisely.

And also to act on the following articles viz.

1st To choose a Moderator

2^d To see if the town will accept of the alterations made by the Selectmen in the Road leading from Lanham School house to Frammingham line and also to see if said town will make specific repairs on said Road and take measures to carry the same into effect. and further to purchase Gravel for repairing the same to do or act as the town may think best.

3^d To see if the town will accept of the alterations made by the Selectmen in the Road leading from by the house of Adam N. Smith to do or act as the town shall think best.

4th To see if the town will discount or refund to Asa Jones and all others inhabitants of Sudbury certain Taxes which have been illegally assessed upon them the past year to do or act as the town shall think best.

5th To hear and act on all Reports.

6th To see if the town will purchase two Fire Engines to do or act as the town shall think best.

7th To Discount certain Taxes that may be offered for that purpose.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
