At a Legal meeting of the inhabitants of town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote at Elections held on Monday the tenth day of September A.D. 1849, the following Votes were given in Sorted and Counted and declaration thereof made as the Constitution requires viz.

The Articles in the Preceding Warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner viz.

1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator

2^a Voted to accept of the Report of the School house Committee and that the same be Recorded.

Report.

The Committee Chosen to repair the Several School houses in town report as follows. That in accordance with their instructions they have sold the Old School house in the Centre district — That they have builded another instead thereof. That they have enlarged remodeled and thoroughly repaired the other four houses That the Whole expence of this operation has amounted to Five thousand fifteen dollars and sixty four cts. That they have drawn on the Town Treasurer to the amount of Four thousand nine hundred and fifty one dollars. That they have received for the Old School house in the Centre district forty five dollars and fifty cts. For five Porches eleven dollars and seventy four cts. For the Old Stoves and funnels Eight dollars and forty nine cts. Amounting in all to sixty five dollars and seventy four cts. Which added to the amount drawn from the Town Treasury equals the sum of five thousand sixteen dollars and seventy four cts. And that there is a balance in the hands
