In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the twelfth day of November next it being the second Monday of said Month at ten of the Clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes for a Governor and Lieut. Governor of this Commonwealth and six Senators for the district of Middlesex all on one ballot.

And also to bring in on a separate ballot their votes for a Representative of said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for District number four.

And likewise to choose a Representative to represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of January next.

And also to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To choose a Moderator
- 2^d To hear and act on all Reports.
- 3^d To see if the town will allow Capt. Nahum Goodnow further compensation for Land taken for a Road and for Fencing the same to do or act as the town shall think best.
- 4th To see if the town will Repair the Road leading from the house of Abijah Wallens to Solomon Duttons to do or act in reference to said Road as they shall think best.
- 5th To see if the town will take measures to Repair or Rebuild Shermons Bridge. also the Bridge near the house of Moses Garfields and the Bridge near Isaac Hurts to do or act on the Subject of said Bridges as the town shall think best.
- 6th To see if the town direct that the timber for Rebuilding or Repairing Shermons Bridge be taken from the Poor Farm to do or act as they may think best.
