In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote at Elections to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the twenty first day of January current it being the third Monday of said month at one of the clock in the afternoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Representative of this Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for District Number four.

Polls to be opened at half past one o'clock P.M.

And also to act on the following articles viz.

- 1st To Choose a Mediator
- 2^d To see if the town will make specific repairs on the Road near the house of Thomas L. Dakin to do or act in reference to said road as the town may think best.
- 3^d To see if the town will unite with the town of Concord in Celebrating the Anniversary of the Battle of April 19th 1775. agreeable to an invitation from said town of Concord to do or act as the town may think best.
- 4th To see if the town will Warm and Light the town hall for the Singing school to do or act as the town may think best.
- 5th To hear and act on all Reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at the town house and each of the Public meetinghouses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Have fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings there on to ourselves at or before the time of Meeting as aforesaid.
