2<sup>d</sup> Voted that Aaron Hume Nahum Thompson & Thomas L. Dakins be a committee to examine the Road near J. L. Dakins and that they be instructed to repair the same so as to make it safe and convenient to travel.

3<sup>d</sup> Voted that Col. Drury Fairbank. Capt. Abel B. Jones. Jona R. Rose Col. Eph<sup>m</sup> Moore and Charles Gery be a committee to take into consideration the subject referred to in this article, and report at March Meeting.

4<sup>th</sup> Voted to Warm & Light the Town Hall for the Singing School at the towns expense.

5<sup>th</sup> Voted to pass over.

Voted to dissolve the Meeting.
