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To Samuel H. Jones Constable of the town of

On the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to vote at Elections and in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the fourth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Representative of this Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for district number four.

Polls to be opened at eleven o'clock for Representative to Congress.

And also to act on the following articles viz.

Art. 1 To choose a Moderator

- "2^d To bring in their votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
- "3^d To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- "4th To hear and act on all Reports.
- "5th To determine the manner of Repairing highways and Bridges the year ensuing and Grant Money for the same.
- "6th To see if the town will Rebuild the Bridge near Col. Moores Mill, to do or act as the town may think best when met.
- "7th To see if the town will sell the Poor Farm or let the same for a term of years, to do or act in reference to said Farm as the town think best when met.
- "8th To see if the town will allow to Knights, Maynard, and others, the amount of their School Tax, to do or act on said subject as the town shall think best.
- "9th To see if the town will order those persons whose fences are on the high ways to remove the same on to the line of said Road, to do or act as the town may think best.
- "10th To see if the town will discount any taxes that may be offered for that purpose.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.
