Voted to take up the seventh article

Voted to accept of the Report of the School Committee.

Voted to accept of the Report of the Committee on accounts

Then voted to allow A. H. Belchers bill of three dollars eighty six cents and J. W. Moors account of eight dollars ninety seven cts also Asahel Balcoms account of eleven dollars sixty cents.

It was then voted to reconsider the vote whereby the town allowed A. H. Belchers and J. W. Moors accounts Then voted to instruct the selectmen to pay all reasonable accounts that may be brought by the Highwaysurveyor on return of their Books the first of May & all Taxes not worked out at that time to be added to the tax of the next year.

Voted to take up the third article Voted to excuse Amwell Bent, Ephraim Moore, Stephen Haynes and Thomas Bent from serving as School Committee, and chose Joseph Insette, John Thompson, Lyman Howe, & Nathan S. Willis, chose Abel Parmenter Highway surveyor in place of Madison Parmenter

Voted to take up the eleventh article

11th Art. Voted to accept of the New Bridge Road as re located by the Selectmen on petition of John W. Haynes & others

Voted to adjourn this meeting to Monday next April the eighth at one o'clock P. M.

Monday April 8th 1850 Met agreeable to adjournment and voted to take up the 8th article.

Voted to Grant the sum of one hundred dollars for Incidental Expenses

Voted to take up the seventh article & Voted to reconsider the vote whereby the town accepted of the Report of the Committee on accounts then voted to deduct Asahel Balcoms bill of forty three dollars and sixty one cts. from said Report and direct the Selectmen to draw on the Treasurer for that amount. It was then voted to accept of said Report.

Voted to take up the eighth article, Voted to Grant the sum of one hundred twenty three dollars sixty three cents to pay acts allowed by Committee on accounts.

9th Art. Voted that the Town Hall be warmed and Lighted for Town Meetings and for the transaction of Political business the ensuing year

10th Art. Voted to purchase a Stove and furniture for the unfurnished Lobby

12th Art. Voted to let out the Collecting of Taxes to the lowest bidder with the understanding that if the Collector is chosen Constable he shall Copy Warrants notify town Officers &c. free of expense to the town. Calvin Morse being the lowest bidder agrees to collect the taxes for sixty eight cents on the hundred dollars the town by their vote accepted of Mr. Morse as Collector
