 the petition of William Maynard & others

Art. 4th To see what time the town will give the several land owners to remove their
 fences & trees off the land over which the Selectman relocated the New-
 Bridge Road (So called) to do or act as the town shall think best.

 selves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
