To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are required to notify the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the town hall in said town on Monday the second day of September next at four of the clock in the afternoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

Art. 1st To choose a Moderator

Art. 2^d To see if the Town will excuse Calvin Morse from serving as collector of Taxes the present year

Art. 3^d To see if the Town will choose a collector of Taxes to do or act on the subject of collection of Taxes as the town may think best

Art. 4th To see if the Town will give Joseph Smith liberty to inclose a small lot in the Burying ground to do or act as the town may think best.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will take measures to new set certain Grave Stones that may be out of place in the Burying yard to do or act as the town shall think proper when met.

Art. 6.th To discount certain Taxes that may be offered.

Art. 7.th To see if the Town will provide a suitable Amory for the Rifle Company in said town to do or act as the town may think best.

And You are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at the Townhouse and each of the Public Meeting houses in said town two Sabbath at least before the time set for holding said Meeting

And of full not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
