The Articles in the preceding Warrant were then taken up and acted upon as follows viz.

Art 1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator

Art. 2^d Voted to accept of the Road laid out by the Selectmen on Petition of Lyman Howe and others

Art. 3^d The Selectmen made a Verbal Report in reference to the Situation of the Road near the house of Isaac Ayres which was accepted, then Voted that Elisha W. Haines and Capt. William Brigham in connection with the Selectmen be a Committee to further Investigate the Subject referred to in said Report and confer with Mr Rice in reference to the amount of damage and Report to the town at the next meeting.

Art. 4th Voted to grant the free use of the Town Hall for all proper purposes the Selectmen to be the Judges.

Art. 5th Voted to rescind the Vote whereby the town Voted to discontinue a piece of Road near the House of Daniel Smith

Art. 6th Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to make the Road referred to in this Art. safe & convenient for travel.
