At a Legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the tenth day of February A.D. 1851. the articles in the preceding Warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows viz.

Art 1st Chose Col. Drury Fairbanks Moderator.

Art. 2^d Voted to choose a committee of three to meet the County Commissioners on the petition of William H. Knights and others.

Chose Col. Drury Fairbanks, Loring Wheeler, & Elisha W. Haynes
Then voted to instruct said Committee to use all fair and honorable means to oppose the establishment of the Road as laid out by the Selectmen but if the Commissioners should establish the Road the Committee should see that the Road is established on the same conditions that it was laid out by the Selectmen.

Art. 3^d Voted to choose a committee of three to defend the suit brought against the town by John W. Rice. Chose Col. Drury Fairbanks, Capt. Abel B. Jones and Newell Bent. Then voted to instruct said committee to defend the suit to final Judgment or to take such other action in reference to said suit as in their opinion is most for the interest of the town.

Art. 4th Voted to pass over.

Art. 5th The Selectmen made a Verbal Report in reference to the cost of Stone Guide Posts. Voted not to purchase Stone Guide Post.

Voted to dissolve the Meeting.
