Art. 4th Chose Ephraim Stone Town Clerk. Qualified in open town Meeting by the Moderator. Voted to lay on the Table the 4th Art. & take up the 8th

Art. 8th Voted that Assessors distribute the copies of the Valuation during this meeting and that the remainder be left in the hands of the Town Clerk for distribution.

Voted to adjourn this Meeting for thirty minutes

The town Met and Voted to take up the 4th Art. and chose for Selectmen James Moore, Levi Dow, and Elisha W. Haynes.

It was then Voted to lay on the Table the 4th Art. & take up the 7th.

Art. 7th Voted to instruct the Committee chosen to defend the suit brought against said town by John W. Rice to settle with said Rice on condition that he will accept of the sum of fifty dollars the town paying all costs that may have arisen. Mr Rice being called
