In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote for Representatives in the General Court of this Commonwealth to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the seventh day of April next at twelve of the clock noon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for one Representative to represent them in the Congress of the United States of America for the term of two years from the fourth day of March 1851.

Polls to be opened at half past twelve O'clock P.M.

And you are furthermore required to notify the inhabitants of said Sudbury Qualified to Vote in town affairs to meet at the above named time and place there and there to act on the following articles viz.

- Art. 1st To Choose a Moderator
- Art. 2^d To choose all necessary town officers not chosen at March Meeting and fill all vacancies that may occur by Non-acceptance.
- Art. 3^d To see if the town will make an addition to their present School Committee to do or act as the town may think best.
- Art. 4th To act on the 5th Art. of the Warrant for March Meeting.
- Art. 5th To hear the Report of the Committee chosen at the last meeting to examine the several Roads in town and act thereon.
- Art. 6th To hear and act on all Reports.
- Art. 7th To Grant money for all necessary purposes for the Year ensuing.
- Art. 8th To determine the manner of collecting the Taxes that may be assessed upon the Inhabitants of said town the present Year and agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
- Art. 9th To see for what purposes and on what conditions the town will allow the town hall to be used for the present Year to do or act as the town shall think best.
- Art. 10th To see if the town will appoint some suitable person to take care of the Town house the present Year and fix the Compensation for the same.
- Art. 11th To see if the Town will Paint the Town House the present Year.
