

April 1851.

At a Legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the seventh day of April A.D. 1851 it being the first Monday of said month the Qualified Voters of said town gave in their votes for a Representative in the Congress of the United States which votes were sorted and counted and declaration thereof made as the Constitution requires viz.

For Representative to Congress
 Whole No. of Ballots one hundred fifty nine
 For Richard Frothingham Jr. eighty three
 " Benjamin Thompson Fifty
 " John G. Palfrey twenty six

The articles in the preceeding warrant were then taken up and acted upon as follows viz.

Art. 1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator.

Art. 2^d Excused William Smith Jr. from serving as Field Driver Left with the Selectmen to fill the vacancy.

Excused Jonas Hunt & Ephraim Moore from serving as Highway Surveyors and chose William Wheeler & Warren Parminter.

Excused William Wheeler from serving as School Committee and chose Nahum Thompson. — Chose Samuel A. Jones Constable

Art 3^d Voted to Pass over.

Art. 4th Voted to Grant the sum of one thousand dollars to Repair Highways town ways & Bridges the year ensuing that it be a Separate Money Tax that the Surveyors have Warrants & made collectors that they give each Tax payer a Legal Notice to Work out their Tax & if they do not appear on that notice a second notice shall not be considered necessary, that the price of Labor be ten cents per hour.

Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to order all necessary repairs on Canal Bridge

Art. 5th Voted to accept of said Report.

Art. 6.th Voted to accept of the following Reports viz.

Selectmens Report in reference to letting out the Making of the Road near the house of Daniel Smith.

Selectmens Report in relation to Erecting Stone Monuments at the Road near mine way Brook.
