3^d Ballot

Whole No. one hundred forty four

Necessary to a choice seventy three

Jona. R. Bose seventy one

Enoch Kidder fifty two

Sewell Hunt nineteen

Scattering two — And no choice

4th Ballot

Whole No. one hundred forty seven

Necessary to a choice seventy four

Jona. R. Bose seventy five

Enoch Kidder fifty two

Sewell Hunt nineteen

Scattering one — And Jona. R. Bose is chosen.

It was then Voted to dissolve the Meeting.
