required to notify the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified
to Vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on
Monday the nineteenth day of January current at one of the clocks in
the afternoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles
viz.

Art. 1st To choose a Moderator.

Art. 2^d To hear the Report of the Wadsworth Monument Committee
and act thereon and pass any votes relative thereto.

Art. 3^d To see if the town will appropriate a suitable piece of Land
on their Poor Farm for a Burial place for the accommodation
of the pauper family.

Art. 4th To hear and act on all Reports and pass any votes relative to
said reports as the town may think proper.

Art. 5 To see if the town will discount any Taxes that may be offered
for that purpose.

Art. 6th To see if the Town will give the Inhabitants the free use of
the Town Hall for all suitable purposes untill the first
day of April next.

And You are directed to serve this warrant by posting
up an attested copy thereof at the townhouse and each of the
public meetinghouses in said town two Sabbaths at least before
the time set for holding said meeting.

your doings thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of meeting
as aforesaid.
