At a Legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the nineteenth day of January A.D. 1852. The articles in the preceding warrant were acted upon as follows viz.

Art 1st Chose Loring Wheeler Moderator

It was then voted to adjourn this Meeting to Monday Jan. 26th at 10 o'clock P.M. Monday Jan. 26, 1852. met agreeable to the foregoing adjournment took up the 2nd Art.

Art. 2^d Voted to Instruct the Wadsworth Monument Committee to petition the Legislature for aid to erect a Monument to the Memory of Capt. Wadsworth and others who were killed by the Indians near Green Hill in said Sudbury.

Art. 3^d Voted to Instruct the Selectmen to stake out a suitable lot of Land on the Poor Farm for a Burial place and Report at March Meeting.

Art. 4th The committee chosen to investigate the subject referred to in the 4th Art. of the warrant of the 10th of Nov. last Reported by presenting a Bond given by Aschel Haynes, to the town of Sudbury binding himself &c. to build and keep in repair a Bridge over a Canal across the Highway near Wash Brook. Voted to accept of said Bond & ordered the same to be Recorded.

Art. 5th Elisha W. Haynes Collector presented for discount a Tax set to Mrs. Abner Goodnow. Voted not to discount said Tax.

Art. 6th Voted to pass over.

It was then Voted to dissolve the meeting.
