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To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote at Elections and in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the first day of March next at ten of the Clock in the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

Art. 1st To Choose a Moderator.

Art. 2^d To bring in their Votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.

Art. 3^d To Choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 4th To determine the manner of Repairing Highways, Townways, and Bridges, the year ensuing and grant money for the same.

Art. 5th To hear and act on all Reports and pass any Votes relative to said Reports that the town may think proper.

Art. 6.th To see if the town will order a Map taken of said town to do or act as the town shall think best.

Art. 7th To see if the town will let their Poor Farm for one or more years, and contract with some suitable person to support the Poor for the same time, to do or act as the town shall think best.

Art. 8th To see if the town will order the Warden on the Poor Farm to do the Sexton business the year ensuing.

Art. 9th To discount any Taxes that may be offered for that purpose.

And You are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the townhouse and each of the public meetinghouses in said town two sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the town clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
