Report of School Committee

Art. 5th Voted to Grant the following sums the present year viz.

For the Support of the Poor five hundred dollars

" Winter Schools four hundred and fifty dollars

" Fuel - Eighty dollars

" Summer Schools two hundred and fifty dollars

" School house debt - ten hundred and sixty dollars

" Incidental Expenses six hundred dollars

" Interest on Jerusha Howe Fund sixty dollars

" to pay the Treasurer, ten dollars

" " " Accounts one hundred thirty three dollars twenty cents

" " Paint the Poor house and Town house two hundred dollars.

Art. 6th Voted that the Taxes be collected in the same manner as last year.

and that the Collecting be let out to the lowest bidder.

Asahel Balcom agrees to collect the Taxes for eighty five cents on the hundred dollars he being the lowest bidder was accepted by the town

Voted to authorize the Treasurer to borrow money for summer schools if it should be necessary.

Art. 7th Voted that the Town Hall be used for the same purposes and on the same conditions excepting that it be left discretionary with the Selectmen in reference to the time the Hall shall be closed at night. Voted that the Selectmen let out the taking care of the Town House.

Art. 8th Voted to direct the Selectmen to paint the Town House the present year.
